This is Ephraim Romm's story, a **Holocaust survivor**, for whom "walking forward is to go back to your childhood" –from childhood to old age and back.

Ephraim Romm's childhood was one of war, Ghetto, hard work, and hiding. And, then, a courageous escape that got him out of the clutches of the **Nazis**, and into a search for his family or whatever was left of it.

Finally, there was **freedom.**What freedom? Is it ever possible to leave behind what he has been through and find real freedom?





#### A Teen-Age Survivor

More than sixty years have passed since the end of the **Second World War** and the Holocaust.

The survivor generation is dy-ing and with it the stories and memories of those who have been through the **Holocaust**.

Soon there will not be any survivors alive and the stories of the survi-vors will die with them.

The monodrama "Oy Esterke" is based on one such story. It is the story of Ephraim Romm who was thirteen years old when the Second World War started in 1939.

Ephraim kept his story to himself for most of his life and only shortly before his death in November 11, 2011 wrote it down and shared it with his family.

#### Esterke -A Doomed Five Year Old

Ephraim's son, Alik Romm, used the story as the basis for this monodrama and is playing his father's impossible and incomprehensible journey. The Director of the play is **Yael Ambar**.

Ephraim's story is accompanied by the vision of **Esterke**, Ephraim's niece, a five year old girl with brown curls, a cheerful laughter, dimples, and a lot of hope.

Also interweaved in the story are other members of Ephraim's family who accompanied his journey during the war but did not survive, leaving him at the end, all alone.
